

HOSE, HYDRANT AND BREECHING - 5 COMPETITORS

1932 Wagga Wagga Programme

CONDITIONS: Five men to be seated on the appliance. Three 100ft. lengths of hose, ... will be in the hose box together with a 1-into-2 breeching piece. Obtain first length of hose, connect to standpipe and run out in the direction of the disc. Obtain second length of hose, connect to first length and run out to the position indicated, attach the branch and ring bell. Obtain 1-into-2 breeching piece, third length of hose and insert breeching piece between the first and second lengths, connect third length of hose and run out in the direction of the disc. Attach branch and ring bell. Connection between first and second lengths not to be broken until first bell signal is given. Event run dry in 1932 and 1937

From 1935 the event was run as one evolution - the breeching piece was connected to first length of hose, the second and third lengths were connected to the breeching piece, run out and discs struck with a stream of water (except 1937). The striking of the second disc recorded

Three lengths 2 3/4 inch threaded hose and brass breeching piece


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
