NORTHERN TERRITORY FIRE AND RESCUE SERVICE

The Northern Territory Fire and Rescue Service held its inaugural Championships in April 2003, using a format different to that of the National Championships, intends to adopt the rules and regulations in future to ensure a team from the NT is prepared for the staging of the next National Championships in Queensland in 2005.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA FIRE BRIGADES

Western Australia's first Fire Brigade was formed in 1856 under military control, the first volunteer brigade at Fremantle in 1885, with Perth forming a brigade later in that year. Volunteer brigades were then formed in other metropolitan centres and in the quickly expanding Goldfields regions. Many of those who made up membership of the new brigades were drawn from the large influx of men from the Eastern Colonies, attracted to WA by new opportunities presented in the wake of the gold rush, coming from all walks of life, many had experience in Brigade work.

The first official "Demonstration" was held in Fremantle in 1898, attracting nine Brigades. An inaugural meeting of Captains was held on completion of this Demonstration and the Western Australian Volunteer Fire Brigades Association (Inc), as it is now known was formed. The Association coordinates Brigade activities and provides representation to Brigades and members.

This year the 100th Demonstration was conducted at Fremantle, celebrating the occasion, Maloone and Northam Brigades, the only two who competed at the first ever Championship and competed in 2003, took part in an exhibition of the Champion Fours as conducted in 1898.

For the first time a pumper event was trialed, arousing much interest. The WA Association to decide if it should be included in future programs as an official event.

Victoria and WA teams have competed at each other's Championships since the beginning of competition. Victorian Brigades to win champion brigade in WA are Eaglehawk, Bendigo, Carrum, Geelong and Springvale, whilst Kellerberrin and Bassandean have taken out the Victorian title.
